General Information

- You will need to bring a water bottle into school each day, filled only with water
- Apple watches and any other smart watch that connect to the internet and take photographs cannot be worn to school

- ❖ You will get homework every Friday, due in the following Wednesday. You will receive a homework book which should be returned to school when your homework is due. Along with some online activities such as TTRockstars, URBrainy and Spelling Shed, you may be asked to complete reading comprehensions, research tasks or challenging maths problems. A record of when you have or have not completed your homework will be kept by your teacher

If you read three times a week, and bring in your reading diary on a Friday to show this, you will move up the chart and work towards fun prizes and activities to do on the last week of term such as baking, cake decorating, arts and crafts and movie afternoons!
