# This Week's Year Group News

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### **EYFS**

Squirrels - This week in Squirrels, we have been thinking about all things Easter! We have been busy making Easter headbands, Easter chicks and Easter cakes (which were yummy!). We have also been using our observational skills and painting daffodils and carnations. We hope you all have a lovely Spring break!

Foxes - What a busy week! We have explored the artwork of Kandinsky and looked closely to see which shapes we could see in his painting. The children then worked together to create their own painting based on his artwork. Throughout the week, children have been busy helping to melt chocolate and mix up rice krispies to make some delicious Easter nests. We have also followed clues which led us to a basket of delicious Easter chocolate. It has been lovely to meet with you all and share the wonderful progress that your children have made throughout the year.

Badgers & Owls - What a busy week in Reception! In Literacy, we completed our final activity on our focused story; 'The Pirates Are Coming'. The children were excited to receive a letter from one of the pirates and they have enjoyed writing messages back. In Maths, we have looked at odd and even numbers this week. We have also explored 3D shapes, learning to name and sort cubes, cylinders, pyramids, spheres and cuboids. Perhaps you can look out for these shapes with your child at home or when you're out and about? The children have also enjoyed Easter art and craft activities this week and created some wonderful pictures. It was lovely meeting up with so many of you in the Parents Evenings.

Acorns - This week, the children in Acorns have loved taking part in Easter activities. We had a great time creating our Easter cards and making chocolate nests during messy play. We have also enjoyed colouring some Easter pictures and listening to some new Easter songs. #### <u>KS1</u>

Year 1 - What a busy last week of term! We have enjoyed making our own fossils out of clay, inspired by Mary Anning's discoveries. We designed, made and evaluated these, using new skills. In celebration of British Science Week, we investigated which biscuit lasts the longest when dunked in water! We predicted, conducted the investigation, then recorded our results. We were interested to find that the digestive lasted the longest. In French, we recapped our knowledge of colours and used these to colour a rainbow. As part of SMSC, we discussed growing and changing, ownership and online safety.

Year 2 - In English this week, the children have been learning to use question and exclamative sentences in their writing. In shared reading, we have continued reading the wonderful 'Claude in the City' by Alex T. Smith, to help develop our comprehension strategies. This includes answering questions by using the strategy of reading and retrieving the correct information and making inferences based on what has been read. In Mathematics, we have continued learning about addition and subtraction of two 2-digit numbers. The children have also been revisiting multiplication and learning their 2,5 and 10 times tables. The children were very excited about our residential visit to Menai and having lots of new experiences. It was a wonderful way to end what has been a very busy spring term.

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#### **KS2**

Year 3 & 4 - What a wonderful week we've had! Both Year 3 and 4 have been working hard to complete their information leaflets on blue whales for English. Year 3 have completed length and perimeter and are moving on to fractions in Maths next term. In Maths, Year 4 have started fractions and will be continuing with these into the next term. Thank you to all who attended the year 4 Menai assembly. The children were extremely proud of themselves.

Year 5 & 6 - It has been a brilliant week to end the Spring term! In Maths, Year 6 have shown great resilience tackling their new topic: Algebra! They have looked at how to write algebraic expressions and have moved on to solving one step and two step equations! Year 5 have continued to work on their unit of fractions, decimals and percentages and have also completed some exciting Easter themed maths activities too! In English, Y5 and Y6 have completed their 'writeaways' and we have been very impressed with their attitude to learning and their application of their mastery keys. The children have written extracts or retellings of 'The Selfish Giant' and some Y6s have even challenged themselves to write a missing chapter in the same style. In History, we have compared life in Baghdad in ~900CE to life in England in the same time period, in areas such as trade, learning and heath and sanitation. The children were fantastic at noticing similarities and differences between both places. On Tuesday, we also had a fantastic art day! We investigated Islamic patterns before designing our own printing tiles. It was wonderful to see you all at Parents Evening on Monday and Tuesday and to welcome you back in to see the children's learning face-to-face.

#### Reporting Children's Absence

School must be informed of children's absence on the first day by ringing 0151 329 3164 and pressing 1 to leave a message. This must be done before 9am. Please ensure you provide the child's name, class and reason for absence.

If your child is absent due to sickness or diarrhoea, they will be unable to return to school for 48hrs after their last episode. This is inline with the Public Health Agency guidance to reduce the risk of the illness spreading.

Any absence not explained is registered as unauthorised.

#### **Appointments**

Parents and carers should make every effort to book routine dental and GP appointments outside of school hours. Where this is not possible, children should only be absent for the time needed for the appointment and travel to and from.

For any prebooked medical appointments copies of appointment letters can be emailed to <a href="mailto:n.brown@woodlands.cheshire.sch.uk">n.brown@woodlands.cheshire.sch.uk</a> in advance so that a note can be added to the register. The school will work with all families on an individual basis if medical absences exceed the maximum threshold.

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
# Your Possible at West Kirby Grammar School

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# Childcare Choices: Get the help that fits your family, so you can juggle work and life

Thousands of families could be saving money on their childcare costs. But some simply don't know what support they might be eligible for.

The Childcare Choices website brings together all the existing childcare offers in one place, so parents can get the help that fits their family. This could be through Tax-Free Childcare, 30 Hours Childcare, or Universal Credit Childcare. Some families might be eligible to use more than one childcare schemes together and get the most out of it. Visit the site at <a href="https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/">https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/</a> to check your eligibility and see if you can benefit from additional support.

And from this year even more help is on the way:

From **April 2024**, eligible working parents in England with children aged 2 will have access to 15 hours childcare.

From **September 2024**, the 15 hours childcare offer will be expanded to eligible working parents in England with children between 9 and 23 months old.

From **September 2025**, eligible working parents in England with children between 9 months up to school age will have access to 30 hours childcare.

If you are eligible, you need to apply for your funding at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-childcare-if-youre-working">https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-childcare-if-youre-working</a>.

You do not need to apply if you are only claiming the standard 15hrs from the term after your child's 3rd birthday. This is automatically in place for all children of that age.

Support is also expanding for primary-school aged children – from September 2024, parents are expected to see an expansion in the availability of childcare in their local area before and after school, between 8am and 6pm, also known as 'wraparound care'.
