Governors held a meeting on Tuesday evening and there were lots of strategic and operational matters being discussed. As part of this meeting governors noted an increase in the number of unauthorised holiday requests that we are seeing in school. As a reminder, the government and local authority are very clear: holiday requests cannot be authorised and, as a school, we are required to report requests to the local authority by return, who then deem whether a fine will be issued. Parents who have been fined in one academic year, and chose to take their child out of school for another holiday that year or the following academic year in term time are also at risk of a second, increased fine. For a third holiday, taken within a 3-year period, this could then result in further action being taken by the local authority. To dispel some myths, any monies raised by fines do not come into school – they are held by the local authority!
