Squirrels Shine in ITERS Inspection

Earlier this week, we welcomed inspectors from the Local Authority for an ITERS assessment of our Squirrels room - an internationally recognised tool originating in the United States, used to evaluate the quality of provision in early years settings. The team were simply outstanding. Our LA inspectors, who visited as part of Cheshire West's quality assurance cycle, were so absorbed and delighted by what they saw that they lost track of time - a rare and glowing endorsement in itself! The warmth, engagement and richness of the learning environment left a lasting impression, and we were incredibly proud to hear we had scored extremely highly overall. With just a few minor tweaks - adding a few more multicultural resources (we had 6 or 7, but needed 10), ensuring musical instruments are available both indoors and outdoors, and bringing a little more indoor nature (think plants or living creatures!) into the room - we would have been on track for full marks. Huge congratulations to our amazing Early Years team - your passion, planning and love for our little learners shines through in all you do and we cannot wait to extend this to our babies next term in Hedgehogs.

Transitions Begin

This week marked the start of our whole-school transition programme. Over two days, pupils from Foxes to Year 5 spent time in their new classes, meeting teachers and beginning to build familiarity with the spaces and routines they'll step into in September. Because of the way we routinely work, children will have visited many of the places they formally saw over the course of the year anyway, but it was nice to mark the event! Alongside this, our new to Acorns, Squirrels and Foxes families joined us for settling-in sessions - thank you to all who came with warmth and enthusiasm. We're so excited to welcome you properly in the autumn.

Our Y2 pupils also continued their library visits and joined KS2 celebration assemblies (they came over to visit me in my office on Tuesday afternoon just to see where all my 'busy work' happens!) - small but significant rites of passage that help prepare them for their next chapter on the junior site.

For our Year 6 children, the journey to secondary school is well underway too - many attended transition days at Whitby High School, and a few had additional bespoke visits earlier in the week. During a visit to Whitby High School on Thursday morning, Mrs Liversey saw our Y6 children lining up in their new Y7 forms and they all shared that they were having a great day and were, in fact, loving it! These are big moments, and we're here every step of the way to guide and encourage. As a parent of young adults, I have been there, I know how challenging transitions can be, across all aspects of life, but when your children are with us, we can ensure they are emotionally secure as they undertake these transitions, ready for the time they go to secondary school and that is no longer a part of the school day for them, as they may well expect full independence.
