Autumn 1 (DT Focus: Build structures)

Theme: Coastlines

Linked Text: Alba the 100-year-old fish

Engineer/Painter: Henry Winstanley- built the first lighthouse in England

<u>Knowledge</u>

- I know the purpose and function of lighthouses in keeping people safe along the coastline.
- I know how to strengthen and reinforce structures using layers of paper mâché.
- I know how to create texture on surfaces for realistic effect.
- I know the basics of a simple electrical circuit to make a light work.

<u>Skills</u>

- I can use mouldable materials (paper mâché) to build a stable structure and create surface textures.
- I can design and construct a lighthouse model that can stand upright and hold a working light.

- I can make a simple electrical circuit with a bulb, battery and switch to produce light.
- I can evaluate their model against design criteria (stability, appearance, working light).

Outcomes

Summer 2 (DT Focus: Cooking and Nutrition - Preparing and cooking flatbreads inspired by Ancient Egyptian food.)

Theme: Ancient Egypt Linked Text: Wisp

Inspired by: Trip to Liverpool World Museum to visit Ancient Egypt Experience.

Knowledge

- I know that food ingredients can come from different places (local and global) e.g. grains grown along the Nile.
- I know that Ancient Egyptians used grains like emmer wheat to make simple breads.
- I know that flatbreads are an example of a staple food still eaten today.
- I know that food must be prepared and cooked safely and hygienically.
- I know that different ingredients can be combined for taste and texture.
- I know that cooking changes the properties of ingredients (e.g. dough becomes bread when heated).

Skills

• I can follow a simple recipe to make a flatbread dough.

- I can measure and weigh ingredients accurately using standard units.
- I can use tools safely and hygienically (e.g. mixing bowls, measuring jugs, rolling pins).
