A Morning in KS1

Welcome to KS1! We cannot wait to learn lots of new things and make many happy memories together!

When you come into the classroom every morning, you will put your bags and coats away on your pegs. We will then sit down at our tables to start our day. We will have a little activity ready for you and then we will begin our register and dinner register. After the register we will have our daily, Read Write Inc. phonics session followed by literacy. One of your literacy sessions each week will be a shared reading lesson. Then we have playtime, snack time and a KS1 assembly. Our final lesson before lunchtime is maths.

## An Afternoon in KS1

Every afternoon you will take part in a range of different activities based on science, topic (history/geography focused), art, music, computing, RE, DT, CoJo's and SMSC. The KS1 topics are listed below.

We will have indoor and outdoor PE each week and the children will continue to arrive at school dressed in their PE kits. (PE days TBC)

At the end of the day, your teacher will let you out through your class door.

## **General Information**

- ✤ You will need a labelled water bottle in school each day, filled with water.
- Please check your jumper, cardigan and coat has your name in.
- Apple watches and any other smart watch that connects to the internet cannot be worn to school.
- Snacks brought in from home must be healthy snacks (fruit, yoghurt etc.) no unhealthy snacks (chocolate bars, crisps, biscuits, cakes etc.) and no nuts please due to allergies.
- You will get homework every Friday, due in the following Wednesday. Homework will consist of a literacy, maths, or a topic activity. A record of when you have or have not completed your homework will be kept by your teacher. A spelling shed log-in will be sent home in the first couple of weeks for you to practice key spellings.
- Each class has their very own reading reward chart. If you read three times a week, and your parent/carer has signed your reading diary/log, you will move up the chart and work towards fun prizes and activities to do on the last week of term such as arts and crafts and movie afternoons! You must bring your diary in every Friday when it will be checked by your teacher.
- Please don't bring any large rucksacks into school as you only need your reading book, homework book and reading log, and space is limited in the cloakrooms.
